TWO YEAR PROGRAM

Description of Program:

Scripps FMIGS began in 2009. The Fellowship is designed to provide additional training and research opportunities for graduates of ACGME-accredited residency programs in obstetrics & gynecology. While the strength of our program was and remains a diversity of surgical cases, significant training in and opportunities for clinical research been integrated into the program over the past several years.

Fellows gain experience in advanced laparoscopic, robotic and vaginal surgery as well as operative hysteroscopy, pelvic floor reconstruction and uro-gynecologic evaluation and surgery. Fellows also obtain significant experience in office-based gynecology practice and procedures. Fellows gain a considerable exposure to the diagnosis and treatment of patients with chronic pelvic pain through our care for patients as a tertiary referral center for this problem. Fellows can expect to operate 3-4 days per week, with an average case distribution of 40% robotic, 20% laparoscopic, 20% vaginal, and 10% hysteroscopic. Formal training in research design and statistics is provided. Fellows work closely with residents from the Naval Medical Center San Diego. Two 24 hour shifts on labor & delivery per month are required (first call taken by midwives).

In addition to the above mentioned faculty, there is a diverse group of 20+ Gynecologic, Urologic, and Colorectal Surgeons with which to gain additional surgical experience.

Candidates for the Scripps MIGS Fellowship must be board-eligible in obstetrics & gynecology and have an unrestricted license to practice medicine in California.
