Description of Program:

Requirements: All applicants must have completed an MD or DO based US or Canadian Accredited Ob/Gyn residency training program and must be eligible to sit for the ABOG certification examination. All applicants must apply and obtain unrestricted medical license to practice in DC, MD and VA

The fellow will spend their time rotating through several surgical and ambulatory sites under the supervision of the Fellowship faculty. The fellow is expected to spend 4 days a week in the operating room, either at the main teaching site of MWHC, or at one of the other surgical sites, such as state-of-the-art Georgetown University Surgical Pavilion. During the time in the OR, the fellow will perform and assist on a variety of cases from typical MIGS, such as total laparoscopic hysterectomy and operative and diagnostic hysteroscopy, myomectomy and treatment endometriosis, vaginal hysterectomy, AP repairs, SCP, etc. While in the OR, the fellow is expected to supervise and teach OB/Gyn residents rotating through MIGS, as well as medical students. The fellow is expected to develop a productive and collegian relationship with FPMRS fellows, potentially leading to a formulation and execution of a joint research project.

The fellow is expected to spend 1 day a week in the ambulatory settings under the directions of the FMIGS faculty. There, the fellow will participate in the pre-and postoperative evaluation of patients, surgical consultations, diagnostic procedures with a very heavy emphasis on in-office diagnostic and operative hysteroscopy and urodynamics. Again, the fellow is expected to be a mentor to the rotating Ob/Gyn residents and medical students during the time spent in office.

Dedicated research/didactics: the fellow is expected to spend ½ day a week in educational activities, including participation in the departmental and divisional conferences, ground rounds, and simulation center exercise. Fellow will be required to design, develop and implement his/hers independent research project under the supervision of the chosen faculty member with the interest in that particular field. Fellow's research project is expected to culminate in a publication of the results in the peer-reviewed journal and/or presentation during major society meeting.
