Rotation Goals and Objectives

1. Identify the academic and clinical roles of a practicing MIGS surgeon
2. Initiate workup and initial management strategies for endometriosis, fibroids, and other complex pelvic pathologies
3. Enhance technical and cognitive surgical skills by assisting in routine and complex surgical cases
4. Formulate initial steps in chronic pelvic pain workup and primary interventions

Program Description

The UNC externship offers a breadth of clinical experiences to rotating residents who wish to immerse themselves into a longstanding, busy MIGS practice. Resident expectations are similar to own UNC cohort in clinic and in the OR. There is protected 1:1 time with faculty and fellows to enhance the educational goals of the rotating resident and to provide meaningful feedback. This rotation is ideal for a motivated learner looking for a hands on experience but also interested in furthering academic pursuits such as research.
