## **Program Description:**

The Beth Israel Lahey Health minimally invasive gynecologic surgery and women's health fellowship is a newly accredited MIGS, AAGL comprehensive program with a strong commitment to elevating minimally invasive women's surgery and health outcomes. Formerly known as the Lahey Health Pelvic Surgery Fellowship originally established in 2003, our program has expanded with the gynecology division now composed of board certified/ board eligible faculty as follows: 8 gynecologists ( 2 AAGL fellowship trained graduates), 2 gynecologist with specialization in MIGS and ambulatory surgery, 2 gynecologic oncologists and one Urogynecologist. The fellow will have exposure to Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility training to broaden their exposure managing cases requiring admission from affiliated ambulatory centers. The recent fellows have participated in more than 300 cases per year. Our goal is to produce highly competent gynecologic surgeons to manage complex benign pathology. The fellow will obtain training in conventional laparoscopy, robotic, vaginal, and open surgery, with an emphasis on complex laparoscopic cases including endometriosis, large uterine fibroids, pelvic pain and adnexal neoplasms. The fellow will actively participate in resident education and surgical simulation. Regular didactics include GYN preoperative conference, GYN radiology conference, GYN Tumor Board, Morbidity and Mortality conference, along with the required surgical simulation and didactics put forth by the AAGL.

Fellows are required to submit at least one article to a peer-reviewed journal and present at least one abstract or video per year at the national AAGL meeting.

Our fellowship currently supports one fellow for a total of 2 years, recruiting one fellow every other academic year.
